#### **DUTIES:**

Reporting to the Senior Facilities of Manager or designate for the operation, maintenance and repair of all buildings and equipment within the scope of the Building Operations Division including high pressure boilers, humidifying, refrigeration, air handling units, electrical, gas, plumbing and fire protection equipment, elevating devices and all other machinery. Performs general maintenance repairs encompassing carpentry and other building trades. Will be required to operate golf cart, fork lift, scissor lift and boom lift on a rare to occasional basis. Must adhere to all applicable Codes, Acts and departmental policies and procedures. Must maintain professional relations with public, non corporate staff and fellow corporate staff. Performs Occupational Health and Safety duties as outlined in the Corporate Health & Safety Program. Performs other duties as assigned.

#### **QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Must have a three (3) year post secondary school community College diploma in Power Engineering and a current valid 4<sup>th</sup>Class Operating Engineer Certificate or Ontario Ministry of Education equivalency and over six (6) months of experience in all areas of the position such as experience in a commercial/institutional or industrial maintenance environment, with the operation of DDC controls systems, HVAC, electrical, plumbing, and general repair exposure.
- Must be able to lift, carry, push or pull items over 60 lbs.
- Must complete a post-offer strength test in an effort to assist the successful candidate in completing the position tasks safely and to aid in minimizing injuries on the job.
